

How the scheme works

The museum has identified **50 wonderful objects from the collections**. Each object has been allocated a “*suggested sponsorship*” figure. Please refer to the separate sheet for details.

- You are invited to sponsor your favourite object(s) by making a donation towards the suggested amount or sponsoring the object for the full amount specified.
- Each object can be sponsored by more than one person.
- When the “*suggested sponsorship*” figure is reached for an object, it is no longer available for sponsorship. In this case, please make a second choice.
- You can sponsor an object for somebody else – give us their name and details.
- You may wish to sponsor a favourite object from the museum which is not on our Top 50 list. Please let us know and we will be very happy to accommodate you.
- Please complete the form with relevant details and bring it to a member of staff or the fundraising team.
- Cheques should be made payable to the Priest’s House Museum Trust.
- Credit card transactions are possible.
